Doing Warfare With the Devil Shepherds Notes by Lee Fisher

“Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand” (Eph. 6:10-13).

Wars have been in existence since the beginning of time and the type warfare mentioned by Paul was conventional for the most part in that day. Wars that are being waged today are very different and difficult to fight because sometimes we cannot see our enemy-he can strike at any time and against anyone. In comparison, the Christian's spiritual warfare is also fighting enemies that we cannot see. These are the principalities, rulers of darkness, and spiritual hosts of wickedness Paul is speaking of. Satan has been out to destroy man's relationship with God from the beginning! So how do we fight an enemy like this?

First, we have to study some of his tactics:

1. Genesis chapter 3 records the first spiritual warfare where a serpent was used. This was not Satan, but he took control of the serpent, because he had characteristics in him that were already like Satan. We also see this in Judas who was already a thief before he betrayed Jesus for thirty pieces of silver (John 12:4-6). Both were used to achieve Satan's goal. Another tactic used is that Satan does not have a face but he always sounds the same. *“Then the serpent said to the woman, “You will not surely die” (Gen 3:4). “Now when the tempter came to Him, he said, “If You are the Son of God” (Matt. 4:3), and “Then one of the criminals who were hanged blasphemed Him, saying, “If You are the Christ, save Yourself and us” (Luke 23:39). So study to know God's purpose and to expose Satan no matter what form he takes!*

2. The term "wiles of the devil" (is defined as methods), and this shows that Christians are fighting an intelligent being who will study our weaknesses. I heard a sermon and the speaker put it something like this, "There are times when we are weak, but the opportunity to sin is not there, and other times when the opportunity is there but you are not weak. Satan works hard to evaluate your weakness and make a temptation so your weakness and opportunity will come together at the same time to get you to sin. Satan will 'tailor-make' temptations for us." Remember, Jesus had completed his fast for forty days and forty nights, and afterward He was hungry. Then the devil said, *“If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread.”* Jesus was tempted with something that no one else could do but Him! Brethren do not underestimate this enemy! Satan had enough influenced to make some of the angelic host follow him and be cast down into chains of darkness (Rev 12:9).

Second, to fight Satan we must be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Without His strength and power we cannot fight the devil. That power is the gospel. *“For I'm not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek” (Rom 1:16).* The Gospel did a whole lot when Christ was raised from the dead (Eph. 1:17-23). *“Christ was set far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come. And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all.”*

The final point in fighting Satan is to put on the whole armor of God, teach others about the salvation which is freely given, pray without ceasing, trust in the Lord, and be obedient to God's word which is source of our faith! In Christian love, Lee.

not allow anything to keep me from you. Only death, or my retiring, would mar our association.

I want everyone to think seriously about this. Is there anything I can do to help you? I am ready to do what I can. The world is not worth it. It offers a lot, but pays little. It lies to us. It deceives us. The devil is pleased. Don't allow anything to keep you from your family here at W.S.YOUNG. Believe me, you are missed! And, you are loved!

I want to see you Sunday. I want to laugh and talk with you...above all, I want to worship God with you. I want all the family to be together. The world promises much, but delivers little.

The most important thing is your soul. The most important thing for your children is their souls. Don't allow the world to get a 'leg-up.' The devil will deceive and lie to destroy you and your family.
