## *I'll Fly Away*

*Shepherds Notes-By Boyce Edwards*

I walked out of my office the other day and saw five balloons making their way heavenward, and I was reminded of the statement of the Psalmist where he said, *"The days of our years are threescore years and ten; and if by reason of strength they be fourscore years, yet is their strength labour and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away"* Psalms 90:10. Of those seventy or eighty years, the NKJV makes the translation of, *"Yet their boast is only labor and sorrow!"* In the previous verses, the writer has spoken of the brevity of man's life and the chastisement of God because of sin, and "the boast" of the seventy or eighty years is only sorrow and toil! But a day is coming wherein God's people can "fly away" from all of their troubles!! THANK GOD!!

In Romans 8, Paul refers to the church as the "the creation," and says of it, *"For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it in hope; because the creation itself will also be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God"*-vss. 20 & 21. Paul further says of this creation, *"Even we ourselves also groan within ourselves, eagerly waiting for the adoption, the redemption of our body"*-v. 23. In the severity of their Egyptian bondage the OT people of God "groaned" to God for deliverance from their affliction-see Acts 7:34. God has placed us Christians in a context of vanity and corruption so that we are groaning (stenazomen, crying out in distress) for the redemption of our body-that is, the resurrection! We are groaning and "hoping" for something better! Paul walked through all the difficulties of his life because he knew there was "something better on the other side!" He knew that beyond fighting the good fight, finishing his race, and keeping the faith, there was a crown of life which would be given to him by the Lord-II Timothy 4:7 & 8. Paul knew the day would come when he would "fly away from all the trials, persecutions, sorrows, and disappointments of life!"

As Christians reflect upon the Psalmist's statement of "flying away," we cannot help but think of the record of the poor beggar who was *"carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom"*-Luke 16:22. I sometimes say of the beggar that he was carried by "Angelic Express" into Abraham's bosom. Since God is no respecter of persons, its logical to draw the conclusion that upon death, the spirit of departed Christians will be escorted to heaven in the same manner!

In II Timothy 4:6, Paul tells us the time of his departure was at hand. The word "departure" is from the Greek, analuseos, "to loose away from," and is a reference to the departure of Paul's spirit upon death to make its flight to heaven to be with the Lord. It's the same word that's used in Philippians 1:23 where Paul expresses his desire to "depart," analusai, and be with the Lord!

Some day those five balloons I saw will return to the earth, but when the Christian dies and his spirit "flies away to heaven to be with the Lord," it will not return to the earth! The abode of God's saints in heaven is eternal!

Albert E. Brumley had it right when he said in his song that Christians often sing:

"Some glad morning when this life is o'er, I'll fly away;

To a home on God's celestial shore.....

When I die, Hallelujah, by and by, I'll fly away." God bless and keep-Boyce.

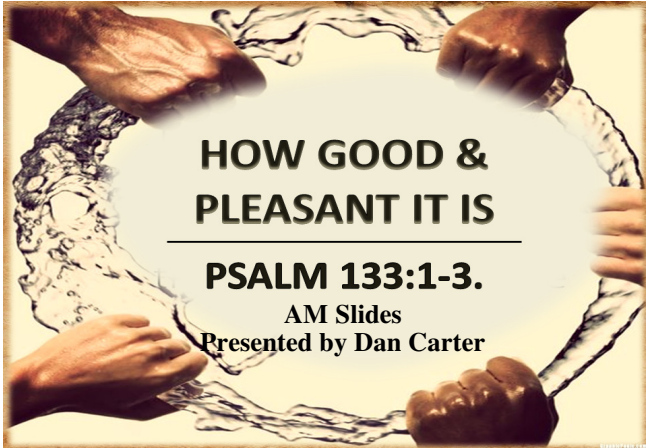

**A CLOSER LOOK AT THE TEXT**

1. **UNITY:** Oneness; To Be Unified; Being Together. \*God's People: One Heart-One Mind (I Cor.1:10,11; Eph.4:1-3,31-32; Amos 3:3; Matthew 5:23,24.)

Note: Joseph's brothers: Genesis 50:18-21!

**A CLOSER LOOK AT THE TEXT,CONT.**

2. **COMPARED:** Vs. 2.

\***Precious Oil:** Exodus 30:23. Aaron & His Sons Were Anointed. Also, Kings Were Anointed.

Note: Christ Is The Anointed One (Psa.45:7; Heb.1:9). Christ Is Prophet; Priest; & King.

\***Dew :** On Herman & Mount Zion.
