Aliesions of the Church

Shepherds Notes by Lee Fisher

"Jesus made a man out of mud and the man walked. I used to make men out of mud – mine wouldn't walk. God did something man couldn't do. Men try to save themselves-can't do it no more than my mud men could walk. But God can do what man can't do-SAVE." (Marshall Keeble)

Some would say that the Church is like any social body which requires a level of organization that sets the conditions for how it operates in terms of scheduling, personnel, finances, and leadership. But what is the mission of the church? What is its purpose for being in the world? Just as the church had a divine beginning, even so it has a divine mission. The mission of the church is a spiritual one and is the same as the mission of Christ which is to preach the Gospel (Matt 25:31-46). By the church God is glorified in the world, and when it ceases to function as the New Testament church, it ceases to glorify God. Christ came into the world that He might save the world, so likewise it is the chief objective of the church to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:10). Therefore it is through the church that this is accomplished and those of us in the church must do all we can to fulfill this purpose individually and collectively.

Benevolence is also our Mission (Matt 25:31-46). Sometimes people say: "What about the poor and the unfortunate? Doesn't the church have an obligation to them?" Yes, it is necessary to do good and relieve the afflicted, the needy and poor; but that is not the primary mission of the church. As Peter explained: "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen" (1 Peter 4:11).

Another Mission of the Church is to keep Christians faithful. Paul said, "And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ:" (Eph. 4:11-12). Who would question the importance of edifying and building unity in the body of Christ? God wants every Christian to grow and be at peace with every other Christian (Phil 2:1-4). He wants us to use our unique talents and skills for the work of the Ministry. Everyone has something to offer, but far too many congregations of the Lord's people have been wrecked by division and discord which stalls or prevents the work of the Ministry.

As stated by Matthew in (28:20), Jesus said, "Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you." The "them" are the ones who are baptized! When the Lord adds to the church such as should be saved, then it is the mission of the church to teach them what Jesus wants them to know. It is not enough to teach them the first principles and then leave them to their own devices - they must be taught to observe all things that Jesus commanded.

The goal of every church is to produce the likeness of Christ in the lives of its members. Its goal in all its work and worship is to reproduce in every member the character of Jesus Christ. Brethren may all of us in the church realize that our purpose is to reproduce the character of Jesus in every member! May it be said of all of us, as it was once said, "Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus"-(Phil 2:5). Let's work towards growth so that we can have the mind of Christ! When we do this, our outlook on life will change, and we will be spiritually focused.
