THE ULTIMATE SACRIFICE

"Greater love hath no man than this that he lay down his life for his friends"-John 15:13.

This is a true story of two boys who lived some two-thousand years apart. One who became a man the day he died; the other, a boy who grew into manhood before he died and left a legacy that has been told and re-told for two-thousand years. Both sacrificed their lives for others. However, very little is known about the early life of either boy.

One was a carpenter's son, and I speak from experience when I say that the carpenter's family was probably poor. My own father was a carpenter. This boy's birth was foretold some seven hundred and forty years before he was born. The prophet Isaiah foretold of the birth of this boy: "And there shall come forth a rod from the stem of Jesse and a branch shall grow out of his roots"-Isaiah 11:1. *"And, she brought forth her first born son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn"-Luke 2:7.* I can well imagine the pride that Mary felt as she wrapped and held here first born. The book of Luke, Chapter Two, in verses 8 through 14, tells us that Angels announced his birth to Shepherds in the fields; praising God and saying: *"Glory to God in the Highest, and on earth, peace and good will toward men."*

The other boy was from Memphis, Tennessee, whose birth was not announced the same way, but I can imagine the pride his mother felt when she saw him for the first time. As a father, I can well imagine the pride his father felt when he first saw the boy and held him in his arms. The boy's name was Ed Claiborne. That boy had a hard life because of the time in which he grew up. He couldn't drink at a public water fountain if it was reserved for "Whites Only." He had to ride in the rear of the bus, which by the way, was the noisiest section of the buses of that time. He was limited to the number of places that he could eat a meal in public, or rest his body at night. He was ridiculed in public and called various and sundry unsavory names. The irony of Ed's life is that our constitution declares that "All Men Are Created Equal." But, many people of the time believed otherwise. However, at the same time though, neither do we know much of the early life of the carpenter's son.

We know that at age twelve, while visiting Jerusalem for the Feast of the Passover, he remained behind after Joseph and Mary left for Nazareth. They missed him the second day, and returned to Jerusalem. After three days, they found him in the Temple talking with, and astonishing, the doctors with his questions and answers. When questioned by Mary and Joseph, he replied: *"How is it that ye sought me? you should have known that I must be about my Father's business?"-Luke 2:49.* As one reads that passage, one can almost feel the frustration felt by Jesus as he seems to be torn between his responsibility to his earthly parents, and his responsibility to God his Heavenly Father. Later in his ministry, Jesus tells the people to repent, or perish (Luke 13:1-5).

Just as Ed Claiborne was not accepted by the public, Jesus was not accepted by his people, either (Matthew 13:54-58; Mark 6:2-4; Luke 4:24; John 4:44). The Scribes and Pharisees, of his time, questioned his lifestyle and his authority (Matthew 12:1,2; Mark 2:23,24; Luke 6:1-11). The night of Jesus' arrest, he prayed that what was to come to pass be removed, saying: *"Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless, not my will, but thine be done"-Luke 22:42.* Jesus also challenged the chief priests, the captains and the elders who came to arrest him: "Be ye come out as a thief with swords and staves? When I was daily with you in the Temple, ye stretched forth no hands against me: but this is your hour, and the power of darkness"-Luke 22:52-53. If there be any doubt in the minds of the readers that Jesus Christ was not only the son of God, but a man facing a terrible ordeal read Luke 22:39-44, and pay particular attention to verse forty-four.

When the Scribes and Pharisees finally had Jesus arrested, they made untrue accusations even though Pilate could find no fault in him. The people and rulers mocked him with a crown of thorns, spit upon him and hit him. *"And the men that held Jesus mocked him and smote him. And when they had blindfolded him, they struck him on the face, and asked him saying, Prophecy, who is it that smote you?"-Luke 22:63-64.* As Christ hung on the cross dying, he asked God to forgive those who were killing him. One man, crucified near him, said: *"Lord remember me when you come into your kingdom."* Jesus promised him: *"Verily I say unto thee, Today you shall be with me in paradise"-Luke 23:42-43.* Jesus' last words were: *"Father, into thy hands, I commend my spirit": and having said thus, he gave up the ghost"-Luke 23:46.*

I challenge the reader to try to visualize and imagine the pain that Jesus suffered. His arms were outspread, spikes driven into his hands and into his feet just below the ankles, then the cross was lifted and dropped into a hole in the ground. The full force of Jesus' body weight pulled down on his outstretched arms creating excruciating pain and making it difficult to breath. Not to mention the pain in his feet while trying to support some of his body weight to ease the pain in his hands, arms, and chest. Jesus suffered this agony, shedding his blood in place of animal sacrificial blood, as atonement for your sins; and for people he never knew.

In the 1950's, an eighteen year old was not considered a man. However, in the fall of 1950 the second boy, now eighteen years old, died in a cold, lonely, foxhole in Korea. This eighteen year old was a member of an All Black Army Unit. The years have dulled this writer's memory, so that I no longer remember the Unit designation. Christ once said: *"Greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends"-John 15:13.* This young black man did just that. He gave his life for his companions. His unit was being overrun by North Korean soldiers. No longer a boy, this man remained behind manning a fifty caliber machinegun so that the remainder of his unit could escape. He gave his life that others might live. A reporter for a Memphis newspaper wrote this epitaph: "The color of the skin, how little does it mean when heart and mind are in the test and values true are seen." -Charles Culver.

Note: Brother Culver has done an excellent article. We further note that the brave soldier was awarded The "Congressional Medal Of Honor", (posthumously).
