Shepherds Notes by Lee Fisher

"FOR WHATSOEVER A MAN SOWETH, THAT SHALL HE ALSO REAP!"

"Now after the death of Joshua it came to pass that the children of Israel asked the Lord, saying, "Who shall be first to go up for us against the Canaanites to fight against them?" And the Lord said, "Judah shall go up. Indeed I have delivered the land into his hand." So Judah said to Simeon his brother, "Come up with me to my allotted territory, that we may fight against the Canaanites; and I will likewise go with you to your allotted territory." And Simeon went with him. Then Judah went up, and the Lord delivered the Canaanites and the Perizzites into their hand; and they killed ten thousand men at Bezek. And they found Adoni-Bezek in Bezek, and fought against him; and they defeated the Canaanites and the Perizzites. Then Adoni-Bezek fled, and they pursued him and caught him and cut off his thumbs and big toes. And Adoni-Bezek said, "Seventy kings with their thumbs and big toes cut off used to gather scraps under my table; as I have done, so God has repaid me." Then they brought him to Jerusalem, and there he died," (Judges 1:1-7).

This story is a very graphic and strong reminder that one day we will all reap what we sow. This is a simple message, but very often understated. "Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap. For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting" (Gal. 6:7-8). In the verse, "Do not be deceived; God is not mocked," lies the root cause of the problem many people face today. They are deceived by Satan. They either do not believe the truth, or they think they will somehow be the exceptions to God's laws.

On the other hand, sometimes we do labor in doing good; but it seems as though we are not successful, at least by what we see, and we get discouraged. So we search for encouragement in many different places, but the true source of encouragement is sometimes overlooked. In the book of Galatians it states, "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not," (Gal. 6:9). Remember that reaping a harvest almost never happens on the same day as sowing the seed. From what we have sown, we may not even see a harvest in our life time. Nevertheless, we must never give up, because we know that at the proper time our God will

reward those who have been faithful servants. Therefore continue to plant, sow, and water, not with the idea that we can make it grow but with the sure understanding that what we sow, God can make grow!

Paul told the Corinthians: "So then neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but God who causes the growth. Now he who plants and he who waters are one; but each will receive his own reward according to his own labor," (1 Cor. 3:7-8).

Also if we sow good things, we are going to reap good things in our life! If we want kindness, we must sow kindness in our life! We all have opportunities to do good. Every day there are moments when we can help someone or say a word of encouragement to them. "As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all men, especially unto them who are of the household of faith," (Gal. 6:10).

"For whatever a man sows, this he will also reap." What a comforting and assuring thought to those who faithfully labor in the Lord, "For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name," Heb. 6:10.


