Shepherds Notes By Lee Fisher

MY VISIT TO ARLINGTON CEMETERY

I'm thankful for the opportunity this summer to have visited Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. Seeing it on TV and in movies has always held my interest, and there are some striking pictures in books and magazine that give you a good idea of what to expect. But actually these things do not compare to being there and seeing the rows and rows of headstones honoring those who gave their lives in Service to our country. We took a tour and the guide mentioned that the Cemetery was a National Shrine to those who have honorably served our Nation during times of war –and during times of peace. It really was a sobering thing to see-the graves of more than 400,000 active duty service members, veterans and their families. I remember a quote we heard later that day from a recording by General Colin Powell that, "Freedom is not free," and that is one reality that Arlington Cemetery brings to mind. The tour guide continued to remind us that 27 to 30 services are conducted there daily. Seeing the graves of so many who have died provokes a lot of thinking. And what went through my mind at that time was, "And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment"-(Heb 9:27). Where would so many stand in the judgment? The Monuments and Memorials displayed honored presidents and members from all branches of the military, from Generals to Privates, astronauts, nurses, chaplains, war correspondents, freed slaves, and of course the tomb of the unknown Soldier. In this life these men and women will never be forgotten – their legacies will live on and forever be a part this Nation's history.

As you look out over a sea of headstones, what was evident to me is that now all of them are on equal ground in death, and their legacies and accomplishments in this life will have no respect of persons in eternity. "And I saw the dead, small and great,

standing before God, and books were opened. And another book was opened, which is the Book of Life. And the dead were judged according to their works, by the things which were written in the books"-(Rev 20:12). This scripture in Revelation emphasizes the fact that when it comes to the end of life, the only thing that matters is for us to have lived a life of faithfulness and died in Christ Jesus. He alone has paid the cost for our freedom from sin. "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. Because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death"-(Rom 8:1-4).

Service to our country is honorable among all and I thank God for those who gave their lives for our freedom, but service to the living and true God is the highest honor any man or women can achieve in this life and in the life to come! Remember, Jesus conquered the Grave!

God bless our Military, especially those of the household of faith!
