HAS GOD FORGOTTEN HIS PEOPLE? Shepherds Notes by Boyce Edwards

Jacob and Israel thought God had forgotten them:

"Why sayest thou, O Jacob, and speakest, O Israel, My way is hid from the Lord, and my judgment from my God?

Hast thou not known? Hast thou not heard, that the everlasting God, the Lord, the Creator of the ends of the earth fainteth not, neither is weary? There is no searching of his understanding.

He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength.

Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall.

But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; they shall walk, and not faint"-Isaiah 40:27-31.

In verse 27, we learn that God's OT people thought God had forgotten about them, and had not given them their due justice! The truth is, God had a right to have forgotten them. God had brought them up, but they had forgotten God-see Isaiah 1:2 & 3. Further, Isaiah posed the question to Judah and Jerusalem, "How is the faithful city become an harlot?"-Isaiah 1:21. So, God's people rightly deserved all the hard-times through which they were passing! But in those hard times their thought was that God had forgotten them! Nothing could have been further from the truth! God was still there for comfort-Isaiah 40:1. He was there to feed and care for them as a loving, caring shepherd-Isaiah 4:11. He was the one who orchestrated the heavens by keeping everything in place and functioning properly-Isaiah 40:26. Isaiah reminded them that He was the creator who never fainted, forgets, nor becomes weary like man-Isaiah 40:28. Instead of forgetting His people, He remained there for those who waited (Heb., kivvoh, hoped, or trusted in Him) upon Him, to empower the faint-hearted, and increase strength to those without strength-Isaiah 40:29. Isaiah reminded them that at times, even the youths would faint and be weary, and the young men would utterly fall, but God would be there to renew their strength. Whether they were walking or running in their service to Him, God would strengthen them so they would not become weary and faint. When they needed the figurative strength to mount up with wings of an eagle, God was there to empower them to do that too-see verses 30 & 31.

God has not changed! He has not forgotten His people! As He was there for His OT people when they trusted and hoped in him, so will He be here for His NT people today! Hard times, heartaches, troubles, difficulties, and living in a sin-sick world sometimes causes Christians to think that God has forgotten them! He hasn't! And may those who are in His church today always remember as long as we are trusting Him, He will impart to us the necessary strength to endure! God bless and keep-Boyce.
