CONTENDING WITH WORRY Shepherds Notes by Lee Fisher

In life we have to contend with a lot of things: failing health, death of a loved one, marriages, children, finances, or a job loss, and the list goes on. As Christians we should not worry, but in reality, worry is something we will all have to contend with. If we say we never worry we might be deceiving ourselves, because worry can be disguised in many forms such as being troubled, concerned, or maybe just being bothered by something. It really doesn't matter by what name we may call it; but the bible says worry or anxiety is not good for us and it has no place in our lives. Think about it, what can it really do for us? "And which of you by worrying can add one cubit to his stature?" (Luke 12:25).

If we are honest with ourselves, we all at one time or another will be concerned about things that are out of our control. I remember when I first joined the Army, my first Job was a crewman for a very large Artillery Cannon, and it weighed tons. In fact, in order to fire that cannon we spent many hours without sleep traveling the backwoods of Southern Germany, going from one firing point to another. I was scared and worried all the time about what might happen. In my mind it was easy to see how someone could get killed from the process it took to just fire the cannon, let alone traveling at night in a convoy at very high speeds. Visibility was always bad due to the weather and training accidents at that time were common. A number of them lead to deaths of soldiers. Looking back at the danger of it, I did not have much control at all.

Things that are out of our control have a tendency to fill us with worry or anxiety to the point that our peace is taken away. Jesus said in Matthew, do not worry, "Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble" -Matthew 6:34). The Greek word for worry (merimnesete) used here, is not just giving attention to the natural things of life. It's talking about things that disturb our peace of mind, or things we elevate to a high level and leaves us in a state of suspense. Or like having a feeling of just hanging in mid-air, which causes us to feel like we can't move on. Or the type of worry that compels us to always try and figure out everything in life. It's important for us to understand that we don't know everything! Christians should never worry about things they cannot change! If we can change things- stop worrying and change them! And if we can't change them, then don't waste time worrying! Turn those things over to God! We should always do our part, or protect ourselves; but do not worry!

Live one day at a time and be thankful for life, health and strength of today. Have you ever seen anyone who was able to live in tomorrow, or back in yesterday? Each day will have its own challenges, problems, and troubles-they are part of life! Paul expresses this thought clearly to the Corinthians when he says, "For indeed, when we came to Macedonia, our bodies had no rest, but we were troubled on every side. Outside were conflicts, inside were fears"-(2 Corinthians 7:5). Some days are not filled with trouble, so always thank God for them! And, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus"-(Philippians 4:6&7).
