Shepherds Notes by Lee Fisher

"IF YOUR BROTHER SINS AGAINST YOU"

"Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother"-(Matthew 18:15).

The first thing we should take notice from this verse is that it starts with, *"If your brother sins against you..."* This process is not for petty complaints, differences of opinions, nor for rumors about mistakes made. It's for handling personal and private sins against you. Think about it, if we all learn to practice this scripture we would be so much better off. The Bible lets us know that this is a prescription for saving souls when personal, private sin takes place. Actually, the question that should be asked of ourselves is, "If a brother or sister sins against us, would we go and tell them?"

Our first step is to make our brother or sister aware of the sin! Many times this step is skipped altogether. In my view this is where some of the biggest mistakes are made. Instead of first going to the one who has sinned, we slander the sinner. We tell everyone else about the sin instead of the person. We text everyone and post it on Facebook. How are we helping them by gossiping about their sin? The person may not even be aware that they have committed a sin or may not have sinned at all! If the sin doesn't specifically pertain to us, it is possible they have repented of this sin and sought the forgiveness of those involved! We won't know any of this if we first slander them instead of going to them. The spark will turn into a wildfire and their reputation will be destroyed!

So what holds us back from going to our brother/sister and telling them their fault against us? Often times fear stands in our way. Sometimes, maybe its the thought of losing that brother/sister, or because confronting someone can be physically stressful, especially when thinking about the fear of failure. In order to maintain spiritual peace, we must heal all matters of tension between brethren! The best way to prevent problems within the church is to deal with them up front between one another. Love between the brethren is much like the love between us and God. *"If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen?"-(1 John 4:20).*

Both parties in a personal offense have the obligation to go to the other! Its not just an issue of sitting back and saying, "It's his/her problem; let them come to me!" *"So, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift"-(Matthew 5:23, 24).* Our goal is to gain our brother back and restore their soul!

Things to remember: if we come to them in a harsh tone with harsh accusations, we will fail! We aren't going to be perfect in our approach. But, if our approach is not good and it lacks gentleness, compassion, understanding, and mercy – we will be the guilty ones. *"A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger"-(Proverbs 15:1).* A careful approach can soften their heart towards repentance. A harsh approach can harden their heart towards rebellion. Just because another has sinned does not give us the right to sin against them. From time to time we all struggle with Matt 18:15, and we cannot force repentance, but our God commands that we provide an opportunity for it.

My daddy didn't want me to go. He kept telling me that "It is not like home, son. You will be hurt and laughed at. You are an 'old country boy' and you want fit in."

Now, to a large extent, dad was right, but from another point he never understood that I needed to go out there and try to make it. He cried when I left. I look back now and I better understand. He loved me, dearly. He did not want to lose me. He wanted me to stay with he and mother as long as they lived. He was not selfish, we were just that close. I often cry as I remember how he looked when I told him I was going away. I did assure him that I would always come back home and be with him some.

Often we think that our little piece of the world is all there is, but it is not. As one writer said: "There is a whole world out there."

God was wonderful in His painting beauty everywhere. I see it in the mountains and valleys; I see it in the sunset and the stars at night. God's handiwork is beautiful.

I don't know why I am writing about this. I guess as our children grow up and leave home, we are made to think about our own lives and what laid before us.

Encourage your children. Let them know that there is beauty everywhere. But, be sure they know that home is always there, and that they are loved. Teach them to build their homes with God as the center. Teach them to raise their kids with appreciation of the God of Heaven who loves and cares for us.

Now, some of you will be seeing your children leave home and go away to college or, take a job, that will take them away from you--but, remember, they are always in your heart, and you are always in theirs, no matter how far away they roam.
