I cannot count the number of meals I've eaten with the other elders. Our normal routine is that we get together on a weekly basis and go visiting and discuss the business of the congregation. The things we discuss range from a need for new lights in the auditorium, to members who are delinquent from our church family. But on every occasion our discussion falls upon our new converts, especially those who have left the congregation. When we think of our brothers and sisters who are no longer with us, we are sad that they are absent from our church family. During these discussions the "Parable of the Sower" always comes to my mind.

Jesus spoke this parable in Mark, chapter 4. *"And again He began to teach by the sea. And a great multitude was gathered to Him, so that He got into a boat and sat in it on the sea; and the whole multitude was on the land facing the sea. ² Then He taught them many things by parables, and said to them in His teaching: ³ "Listen! Behold, a sower went out to sow. ⁴ And it happened, as he sowed, that some seed fell by the wayside; and the birds ^[a] of the air came and devoured it. ⁵ Some fell on stony ground, where it did not have much earth; and immediately it sprang up because it had no depth of earth. ⁶ But when the sun was up it was scorched, and because it had no root it withered away. ⁷ And some seed fell among thorns; and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it yielded no ^[b] crop. ⁸ But other seed fell on good ground and yielded a crop that sprang up, increased and produced: some thirtyfold, some sixty, and some a hundred." ⁹ And He said ^[c] to them, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!"*

When Jesus said "Listen," and "Behold," yes, He wanted them to listen, but not just with their ears; but especially with understanding of their spiritual heart. When individuals listen this way, they are enabled to keep on hearing and applying Gods word to every situation. He was not just "stating a parable," but He wanted them and us today to see ourselves in relation to this parable. How we see, hear, and respond to the word of God is how we will bear fruit. If God's word is planted in the right heart, His word will change us! Sadly, not everyone will be changed! In this parable, it looks like only ¼ of those will hear the word, accept it, and bear fruit. But a small number of people can make a difference! God wants everybody to be saved, but He does not need everybody to accomplish His will-see Judges chapter 7. How we apply God's word to our lives makes a difference! Every day we look in the mirror to see what's wrong, or to determine what needs to be changed, and we make it. The bible says: *"²² But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. ²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man observing his natural face in a mirror; ²⁴ for he observes himself, goes away, and immediately forgets what kind of man he was. ²⁵ But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does."* (James 1:24-25)

The same applies to God's word. Jesus said "He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" "Hearing" means understanding, obeying, applying it, and living by it. Let's not be casual listeners, because this type of listeners do not understand that when tribulation or persecution arises, they will immediately stumble! To prepare ourselves we must study to feed the spiritual man, and those who "hunger and thirst after righteousness," will be filled! See Matt. 5:6.

A very familiar passage is found in Psalm 133:1. This Psalm is attributed to David: *"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity."*

And, how true that is. I remember in our Lord's prayer for the disciples, He prayed *"...that they all may be one..."*-John 17:21. Unity among the brethren is a great and blessed thing. Division destroys; unity builds.

There are many other things that come to mind. A family needs to be united. One of the problems seen in the world today is that children are brought into this world and abandoned to their own fate. When we see the problems racing our nation to peril, the main problem is the home. Divorce is at an all-time high; as well as Mate-swapping and Role-changing! We recall that Romans chapter one spoke of things God hates, yet man keeps on practicing! Listen to a few of those words from God: *"Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness, full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity, whisperers, backbiters, haters of God, spiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, without understanding, covenant breakers, without natural affection..."*-Romans 1:29-31. The last verse of that chapter ends like this: *"Who knowing the judgment of God, that they who commit such things are worthy of death, not only do them, but have pleasure in others who do the same thing."*

What hurts most of all in those verses is when the record declares, "having pleasure in others who do the same thing!" It hurts to see evil; but even worse is the enjoyment of getting many involved in that evil. Yes, a Family devoted to God is a "Good & Pleasant Thing!"

Another Good & Pleasant Thing to me is to see True Friendship: *"A Friend sticks closer than a*

brother"-Proverbs 18:24. Listen, to this verse: *"A Friend Loves At All Times"*-Proverbs 17:17.

I am one who knows how wonderful and pleasant it is to have dear friends. I have friends all over the country. Calls come to me often from those dear friends of years gone by. Isn't it wonderful to have friends? It is just as wonderful to be a friend. You have the opportunity often to make friends and influence others to Christ.

One last verse: *"You are my friends, if you do whatsoever I command you"*-John 15:14.
