WE HAVE NO ALTERNATIVE BUT TO FIGHT

Shepherds Notes by Lee Fisher

Historians say some of the great Wars fought in history could have been prevented, but one thing is certain the War for our soul is inevitable, either we fight or die!

"And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell" (Matt 10:28).

The battle for our soul will come in many different forms. One of the most frequent and destructive is discouragement. There seems to be no individual "cause" of discouragement. Discouragement can come from many pressures, stresses, and the unpredictability of life. Sometimes discouragement is not the result of one thing, but the combination of many things. The Apostle Paul wrote to the Ephesians, *"For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places"* (Eph 6:12). This scripture tells us that our battle is a "spiritual" one, not physical, and it is against ruling devil spirits in high authority or governmental rule in the world. The more we strive to be Christ like, be assured a conflict with Satan's spirits and his schemes cannot be avoided. Remember that old idiom "take ONE step forward and get pushed TWO steps back." Sometimes it feels like every step we take seems to be contested. But if our hearts desire is to please God, who hath called us to be a soldier for Christ, then we have NO alternative but to fight on!

The Christian soldier puts on the full armor of God to wage a good warfare. The more strenuous the struggle, the more glorious the achievement. If we allow our discouragement to stop us from doing the work that God has set before us to do, then we have allowed fear to take control of our actions. However, if we say to ourselves, "Yes, I feel miserable right now, but I am going to do God's work anyway," then we will be able to conquer that fear. We must encourage each other to continue faithfully in God's work as we press toward the goal of heaven.

If you want to get rid of discouragement, then get busy doing something productive in the kingdom of God! Visit the sick; go to a nursing home; teach a personal bible study; help some orphans; maybe go on a mission campaign; get on the list to vacuum out the church building; anything that you can do for the Lord, do it! *"For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ"* (2 Cor 10:3-5 NIV).

So fight for God, fight for your Marriage, fight for your Family, fight for your Children, and fight for your Soul! *"My God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus"* (Philippians 4:19). Our God can furnish us with all that we need to wage a good warfare. "Blessed is the man who trusts in Him."

INFLUENCE

Often we have had someone tell us what an impact we have had in their life. That is a statement most of us have received from another. It should trigger a feeling of humility to think that we could so influence another by our manner of life that we would determine that whatever we do from then on would be for good and no harm. Someone coined the phrase: "Actions Speak Louder Than Words." I believe that statement.

Let me tell you of an Uncle and Aunt whom I loved and respected so deeply. My Uncle Paul and Aunt Ruby came to see us every year at about the same time during the summer months. I shall never forget them. As a child Uncle Paul and Aunt Ruby made a lasting impression on me. Dad had three brothers. Dad was the eldest, then Harley, Paul, and Alvin. I loved them all. They were the kind of people whom one could never forget. All of my Uncles meant the world to me. Now, they are all gone, including Dad. I miss them. I remember how I felt when they would come visit.

I chose Uncle Paul to talk about because he drove a Buick automobile. It was long, black, and shiny. Dad had old cars but they were mostly worn out by the time he got any of them. Uncle Paul had this nice Buick! He would take me for rides. I was so impressed! Uncle Paul and Aunt Ruby lived near Lubbock, Texas. I had never been there and figured it must have been far, far, away!

One time a horse pawed me. It almost cut off my left arm. Uncle Paul happened to be at our home visiting, so he rushed me, mama, and dad, to the doctor in that Buick! I will never forget him.

I am sure that you have had similar experiences. You know what I mean. Especially, little children are greatly influenced by those older. We should do all we can to ensure that our influence is the type that will be remembered for the good. Children need many things in life, but the most important need is DIRECTION. They need to see Christ living in us. They need to know that discipline is needed and that true love will bring them up in the

way of the Lord. Let us all so live that our influence will be remembered as good, not bad.

We usually do not even realize that others are watching us, or even listening to us as we talk. We influence more people than we imagine. And, as I said before, little children look up to the older folks for direction. Mammias & Dads have a great opportunity to teach by word and example. Neighbors are also affected by what they see in us.

The Apostle Peter said: "Christ left us an example, that we should follow in His steps." That statement says it all. Remember this statement about the Lord: "...He went about doing good..."-Acts 10:38? There it is! Let us determine to 'go about doing good.'
