Moving Beyond Our Problems *Shepherds Notes from Lee Fisher*

The danger of living in our world today is that we can become more focused on our problems rather than on our God. Especially during this ongoing coronavirus Pandemic which is very stressful for many people and their families. When this happens, we lose the proper perspective and think that we can overcome things by ourselves, but eventually all our problems grow too big for us, and in our heart we believe, “*The everlasting God, the Lord, seems small. Jesus said “For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, ‘Be removed and be cast into the sea,’ and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says”-(Mark 11:23).* Instead of moving mountains by faith as mentioned in the verse above, we become constant worriers, creating doubt and needless pressure for ourselves and others.

We read in Matthew, “*Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble”-(Matthew 6:3).* We do not know what each day may bring but God offers us far more than uncertainty, fear and anxiety. “*Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall;”-(Isaiah 40:28 -30).* This scripture tells us that if we will depend on Him, He will renew our strength, and wings of faith will lift our hearts above any problem that we might have, or seems too big to overcome. But in reality our problems are small compared to our God in heaven. And that makes all the difference in this troublesome world!

In the book of Ruth, God reminds us that He is much bigger than the tragic loss that Naomi endured. In the story of Ruth it speaks about her mother-in-law Naomi. She followed Elimelech her husband to a foreign land in the country of Moab and lost everything she held dear during their time away from home. After the death of her husband and two sons Mahlon and Chilion, Naomi returned to Israel and took Ruth with her. When they arrived in Bethlehem-Judah, Naomi was pretty discouraged. Though her name meant “pleasant,” she asked her friends to call her Mara which meant “bitter”-(Ruth 1:20, 21). God restored her hope and pleasantness, and most of all Joy! In the end, she and Ruth had a wonderful relationship because of God’s goodness. Naomi experienced trials, but emerged victorious through the hand of God in the end. Gods’ words aren’t meant to belittle us, but rather to encourage us to look to Him and gain His perspective of life! “*Also the neighbor women gave him a name, saying, “There is a son born to Naomi.” And they called his name Obed. He is the father of Jesse, the father of David” (Ruth 4:17).* Would you have imagined this outcome after so much pain?

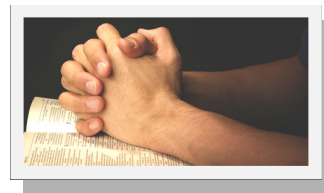
