XAVIER SEAY HONOR ROLL

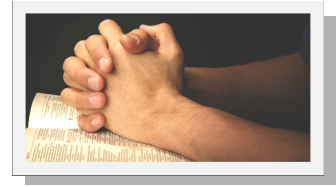
