WE ARE UNDER WHICH LAW?

The apostle Paul wrote this to the Galatian churches who were struggling with why they could not obey the Old Testament Law of Moses for their rule of faith and practice while under the New Testament Law of Christ.

"You foolish Galatians! Who has bewitched you? Before your very eyes Jesus Christ was clearly portrayed as crucified. I would like to learn just one thing from you: Did you receive the Spirit by the works of the law, or by believing what you heard? Are you so foolish? After beginning by means of the Spirit, are you now trying to finish by means of the flesh? Have you experienced so much in vain—if it really was in vain? So again I ask, does God give you his Spirit and work miracles among you by the works of the law, or by your believing what you heard? So also Abraham "believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness." Understand, then, that those who have faith are children of Abraham. Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: "All nations will be blessed through you." So those who rely on faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith. For all who rely on the works of the law are under a curse, as it is written: "Cursed is everyone who does not continue to do everything written in the Book of the Law." clearly no one who relies on the law is justified before God, because "the righteous will live by faith." the law is not based on faith; on the contrary, it says, "The person who does these things will live by them." Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us, for it is written: "Cursed is everyone who is hung on a pole. (Deuteronomy 21:22-23), He redeemed us in order that the blessing given to Abraham might come to the Gentiles through Christ Jesus, so that by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit" (Galatians 3: 1-14).

Let us learn from the foolish Galatians! We are under the Law of Christ. The law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by *Jesus Christ* (John 1:17). God formerly gave His revelations in time past to the fathers by the prophets but today He speaks to *us by His Son* (Hebrew 1:1-2). The Galatians struggled with the question of how much authority should be given to Christ; even today in religion it's still debated. Jesus is not and has never been just another prophet, He said Himself *"All authority has been given to me in heaven and on earth"* (Matt 28:18). John tells us if we reject Him we will be judged by the words that He has spoken, at the last day (12:48).

Paul continues to explain in Galatians 3:20 that a mediator, however, implies more than one party; but God *is one*. Is Jesus a mediator today? Again Paul speaks to this in I Timothy 2:5, *"For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus."* A testament is a document stating what a person wishes to leave to his/her heirs in the event of his/her passing. The Hebrew writer clarifies, in (ch 9:15-17) *"For where there is a testament, there must also of necessity be the death of the testator. For a testament is in force after men are dead, since it has no power at all while the testator lives."* Jesus is a mediator of a better covenant, if that first covenant (the Old Testament) had been faultless, would God have given us the second covenant (the New Testament)? Hebrews makes it clearer *"But now He has obtained a more excellent ministry, inasmuch as He is also Mediator of a better covenant, which was established on better promise. For if that first covenant had been faultless, then no place would have been sought for a second."* When God gave the new covenant, He made the first or (the Old Testament) obsolete or (no longer in force) *"And He has taken it out of the way, having nailed it to the cross,"* (Hebrews 8:6, 13, Colossians 2:14).

• **Now we no longer can be justified by the Law of Moses.** *"Therefore let it be known to you, brethren, that through this Man is preached to you the forgiveness of sins; and by Him everyone who believes is justified from all things from which you could not be justified by the law of Moses."* (Acts 13:38-39).

• **Abolished the law of commandments.** *"having abolished in His flesh the enmity, that is, the law of commandments contained in ordinances, so as to create in Himself one new man from the two, thus making peace"* (Ephesians 2:15).

• **Now that faith has come, are we under the law?** *"But before faith came, we were kept under guard by the law, kept for the faith which would afterward be revealed. Therefore the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith. But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor"* (Galatians 3:23-24). *(continued on page 2)*

•**Paul says, ye also are become dead to the law by the body of Christ.** *“Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another—to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God”* (Romans 7:4).


•**Paul says, now we are delivered from the law, is the New Testament the law spiritually binding today?** *“But now we have been delivered from the law, having died to what we were held by, so that we should serve in the newness of the Spirit and not in the oldness of the letter”* (Romans 7:6).

It’s so sad to say there has been so much misunderstanding about the nature of God and His law among men that the truth isn’t so obvious today, even among the children of God. Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us – for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree.” Scripture reference NIV, NKJV.

Here is another verse we should never forget: “We walk by faith, not by sight”-2 Cor. 5:7.

How about that? So, when things come against us just remember to whom we belong; reach for the Sword of the Spirit-The Word Of God- and stand fast. Remember, ‘faith comes from hearing God's Word’ -Romans 10:17. Never give up. Do not forfeit the greatest blessing ever: Eternal Life.
