Trust

Shepherds Notes by Lee Fisher

Walls are built to keep predators out, but if we are not careful they can keep the good out along with the bad. Unseen walls can also serve to imprison those inside of them. Without trust, there is no "Anchor in the Storm." Sometimes we hear people say, "If I had lived during the time of Christ or if I saw all the miracles first hand that God performed in the wilderness with Israel "Then I would have believed!" Would we have? For people who believe in themselves instead of God no amount of evidence is enough. Listen to the words of Jesus to those who saw all the miracles He did: *"If they do not hear Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded though one rise from the dead"* (Luke 16:31). I confess, I have not always fully trusted God as I should and I continue to work towards a stronger spiritual life. But sometimes we need to slow down and take the time for a self-inventory and reflect on the many times that God has provided for us. Just think about how many times He has brought us through the challenges and trials of life and set us on a path better than you could have ever imagined.

Numbers 23:19- *"God is not a man, that he should lie, nor a son of man, that he should change his mind. Does he speak and then not act? Does he promise and not fulfill?"*

Joshua 23:14- *"Behold, this day I am going the way of all the earth. And you know in all your hearts and in all your souls that not one thing has failed of all the good things which the Lord your God spoke concerning you. All have come to pass for you; not one word of them has failed."*

That being said, despite all the fulfilled promises we sometimes get to a point that we are still afraid to hope. Hoping can be such a fearful thing, especially when you have already made up your mind you will fail. Satan does not want people to have hope, because hope is a powerful tool of God for good (Romans 15:13). Joy, peace, and faith are powerful tools that enable the Christian to abound in hope. The more we trust in God's word and search out what "God's Love" really means, the more we are able to exchange our fears for hope, 1 John makes this clear *"And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in him"* (1 John 4:16). It is time for us to realize that we can no longer trust God in small doses. A little bit of faith can only prevent us from fully trusting God and keep us from a Trust that results in limitless possibilities. Just look at the rich young ruler in Mark 10:29-30 *"So Jesus answered and said, "Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My sake and the gospel's, who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time—houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions—and in the age to come, eternal life."* In our Sunday morning Bible class, we just finished a short study on the children of Israel how their faith was tested and they failed. As a result, many missed the Promised Land and died in the wilderness. Men are no different today and neither is the Lord (Hebrews 13:8). Many in our nation and, yes, even in the church, refuse to obey, do not truly trust in the Lord by following His Word, and continually move further and further away from God and move closer and closer to becoming lost forever. Overcoming fear means letting go of self *"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths"* (Proverbs 3:5-6). 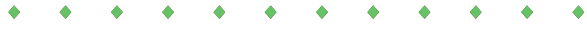
