## **Turning The Unmotivated to Motivated**

How do we get people that are busy, bored, stressed out, disillusioned, unmotivated, and even spiritually immature to engage in true fellowship, attend training opportunities, and get involved with laboring in the church? In (Hebrews 10:24) to "consider one another to provoke unto love and good works." In this verse the word 'provoke' is in a positive connotation, which means to stir up. It is easy to stir up hate and godless deeds; but it takes much more work to stir up another to love toward good works. We can answer this question by looking at Jesus who knew how to connect with people in ways that caused them to leave all and follow Him.

In Matthew 14:13-21, Jesus met basic physical needs, like feeding the multitudes and healing the sick as well as meeting their deepest spiritual needs. Jesus took a holistic approach that prove true compassion with the involvement of the disciples. In Matthew 10, Jesus called His 12 disciples to serve Him in a special way. These were common men with no impressive details about them, but when Jesus called them, they followed. In an ideal world, people would get involved simply because they love the Lord. While that motivation certainly should be encouraged and nurtured, we need to be realistic about where people are now. Meet their lower-level needs and eventually the unmotivated will then become or be transformed into motivated in the higher areas. Helping to free people up from what is holding them back and rely on the confidence of God through Christ. Illuminating the feeling of boredom and unmotivated which is the emotional or physical state one experiences due to lack of mental stimulation, activities to do, or interest in one's surroundings. How can we expect others to be excited about serving the Lord if we aren't? Zeal is an eager desire or endeavor with enthusiastic that is caught more than it is taught. How can we expect others to engage in the spiritual disciplines leading to growth if they do not see or hear of our walk in Christ in these ways? Christians must strive to live with passion, not apathy, and overcome boredom with positive productivity. If we are bored because we are lazy, then there is a problem. Proverbs 6:6-11 provides a harsh admonition against laziness; "Go to the ant, you sluggard; consider its ways and be wise! It has no commander, no overseer or ruler, yet it stores its provisions in summer and gathers its food at harvest. How long will you lie there, you sluggard? When will you get up from your sleep? A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest—and poverty will come on you like a thief and scarcity like an armed man." Colossians 3:23-24 says, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ." Believers glorify God by living their lives to the fullest, exhibiting a "quiet" testimony by living as Christ would (Matthew 5:16). The apostle Paul staved off boredom with hard work in order to help the weak and supply the needs of the ministry (Acts 20:34-35). In Athens, when Paul had some "down time" while waiting for Timothy and Silas, he never got bored, he got to work with preaching to whoever would listen (Acts 17:16-17). We have such a significant privilege associated with our new life in Christ; the way we enjoy motivation is from one another worshipping together. We grow in faith with a joined togetherness overcome doubts and questions. An idle person who does not engage in work, ends up filling his/her time with less than helpful activities that can lead to gossip, rumors, tantalizing, and the lack of activity only led to then into sin that can tear others down!

Paul wrote in (2 Thessalonians 3:11), "For we hear that there are some which walk among you disorderly, working not at all, but are busybodies." When it is time to work, however, Christians should jump right into the opportunity. We should make the most of our time and talent, doing what is for God, others, and ourselves rest when it is time rest, and work when it is time to work! Each decision we make to obey God's Word will bring a preeminent sense of order into our lives, but each decision to disobedience will bring confusion and destruction.

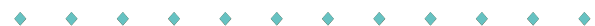
### **SUNNY GLEN CHILDREN'S HOME FOOD**
