How did you get to where you are right now? What decisions did you make which resulted in your presence at this particular moment in time? The multitude of decisions we make every day determine where we will be at any point in time and our existence is also affected by the decisions of those around us. We are moved about as if multiple ripples on the face of water, flowing and retreating as a result of other ripples that collide with ours. To most people their relationships might be a result of something they consider akin to fate- what will be, will be. Such an outlook on life though seems to me, bleak; abdicating control over personal destination (or believing that control is beyond our grasp)

seems a somewhat hopeless, if easy, way to approach life. We each choose who we are, who we love, where we live, where we worship, and the career path we follow, and so on. Our lives are not left up to some cosmic formula that has predetermined the boundaries of our existence. That we have choices in life is outlined, if nowhere else, in the farewell speech of Joshua (24:15) where he urged the Hebrew people to "choose" who they were going to serve as their spiritual guide and leader. There is a measure of control over your life that you assert and the decisions you make impact your future and even those around you. God has granted us the freedom to enjoy an individuality that is unique to our person.

The fact that mankind has been gifted personal control over his destination makes the next portion of our brief study even further unfathomable. We live in a world owned, created, and sustained by God (Col. 1:16; Heb. 1:3). God is aware of all that happens in this world, from the movement of the stars to the innermost personal thoughts we might have (Ps. 139:1-4). Though God possesses all power, He has chosen to allow us personal decision making ability and, at the same time, exert through us and His creation, His will. Have you ever heard the term "providence" used in relation to God? It is generally referred to as God interacting with mankind to bring about His will, working within the confines of the natural law He ordained. So then God is capable of bringing about wondrous blessings and progressive machinations of the church while allowing us to make our own decisions. Can you imagine how much that means God knows? Can you imagine how much God's wisdom and omniscience must weave throughout our abundance of decisions, our changes of mind, our fickle nature, and our procrastination to consistently and perfectly accomplish His will? There is no better term than the aforementioned word: unfathomable. The knowledge and power of God should humble us and render us in absolute awe.

Surely you've experienced such activity in your own life. Providence is generally not something we always notice at the time; rather in hindsight we wonder, "Did God do this?" You never know what good God might be accomplishing through you for the benefit, assistance, advancement, maturity, or spiritual health of someone around you. When you have an opportunity to serve, remember the words Mordecai dispatched to his cousin Esther when, in Esther 4:14 he said, "For who knows whether you have come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" Who knows what service you can render the kingdom for God. Who knows where God might use you in the future? Who knows the role you might play in the enlargement of the Lord's church in this area. Who knows indeed! God alone is wise (1 Tim. 1:17); let us pray He uses our ripples to positively effect someone else's.

Married To an Unbeliever

God allowed marriage as a gift to Adam and Eve according to Genesis 2:24. They were created perfectly for each other. Marriage wasn't for convenience but was instituted by God based on three basic conditions. Firstly, the man leaves his parents and promises himself to his wife; secondly, the man and the women are joined together with the responsibility for each other's spiritual welfare by loving above the other; and thirdly, these two are united into a unity of intimacy and commitment. But what if you are married to an unbeliever? This can be one of the most difficult challenges in a Christian's life. Marriage is a sacred covenant that joins two people (a man and a woman) together in one flesh (Matthew 19:5). It can be very difficult for a believer and an unbeliever to live in peaceful harmony (2 Corinthians 6:14-15). If one partner becomes a Christian after the marriage the inherent struggles of living under two different authorities quickly becomes apparent.

Christians married to unbelievers will need to pray for the power of the Holy Spirit to enable them to profess Christ and live in the light of God's presence (1 John 1:7). Often Christians in this situation will look for a way out of the marriage, persuaded that this is the only way to truly bring honor to God. His Word, however, says the contrary. It is very important not only to be content in our situation, but also to look for ways to bring glory to Him out of our challenging circumstances (1 Corinthians 7:17). The Bible specifically addresses those who are married to unbelievers in 1 Corinthians 7:12-14. If any brother has a wife who is not a believer and she is willing to live with him, he must not divorce her. And if a woman has a husband who is not a believer and he is willing to live with her, she must not divorce him. The unbelieving husband has been sanctified through his wife and the unbelieving wife has been sanctified through her believing husband. So it should be the priority of every Christian to pray for his or her spouse and set a good example, allowing Christ's light to shine brightly (Philippians 2:14). May the truth that's found in 1 Peter 3:1 transpire that an unbelieving spouse is "won over" be the hope and goal of every Christian who is married to an unbeliever. It should be top priority to every Christian to pray for his/her spouse and to set a

good example, allowing their light to shine before the spouse.

Paul addressed this concern and desire of the believer to serve Christ faithfully. He also affirms the marriage commitment, God's plan for the husband and wife to stay together, even when one spouse is not a believer. The believing spouse should strive to win the other to Christ. It could be easy to justify leaving; however, Christians should rather strive to be a positive influence in the marriage, knowing that marriage is permanent (Mark 10:1-9).


