Make Time to Listen: To Others

Imagine momentarily that you are having a disagreement with someone. That wasn't very difficult was it? With an approximated eight billion humans inhabiting this world is it an absolute inevitability you will disagree with someone about something at some time. Oftentimes the numbers don't even need to be that large- in a church of one hundred people or a home of four there will be disagreements. How we conduct ourselves during such an exercise is paramount as it can bless the person with which we're having the disagreement, it can cause them harm, and it can create bitterness; it also can reveal much about our heart's health as it pertains to our relationship with God (Matt. 12:37).

Of all of the ways in which relationships break down, communication is likely at the top. Some people don't communicate their thoughts very clearly or effectively and some people don't create an environment for others to communicate their thoughts, quickly dismissing the opinions and words of another. It is easy to be blinded by our individual ambitions and personal world view which can preclude our acceptance of another viewpoint (Jam. 1:19). Permit me to give an example, referencing again that disagreement I asked you to picture: You are waiting as the other participant to the conversation (discussion/disagreement/argument) and, while that person is speaking, you are formulating in your mind what you're going to say and how you're going to respond. If you've ever done that you have created a roadblock to the path forward for improvements in your relationship with that person. When we are so ready to impart our thoughts and points of view to someone else that we are quietly disregarding their opinion and simultaneously crafting our rebuttal, we are not communicating. Such an approach is fruitless and will only stagnate or even erode lines of effective, mutually beneficial communication.

Forcing oneself to be open, really open to the words of another can be a difficult task (Prov. 12:15). After all, can we help it if our opinion is consistently the right one? Can we help it other people are wrong so often? I hope you can perceive the tongue-in-cheek nature of those last two sentences, as they outline a far too often expressed way of thinking in a facetious manner. Truly listening can be a blessing. Believe it or not, you can be wrong (don't feel too much pain, we've all been there and will be again)! Listening to the advice of those older than you, more experienced than you, more studied than you, and even more faithful to God than you can be a massive benefit. In fact, God provided for us such a blessing in His formulation of a spiritual family to guide and exhort us (Titus 2:1-4).

I believe there are elements of listening even implied in Jesus' correction and instruction as it related to the "beam" and the "speck" in His sermon on the mount (Matt. 7:1-5; Lk. 6:41-42). Jesus did not say one had not the ability to attempt to correct and assist their brother spiritually, nor did He mandate that they should disregard such ambition. He said first remove the beam from your eye, so that you could see clearly to help another. I believe implied there is a situation where one Christian addresses their own spiritual shortcomings and is perhaps able to then assist someone else who struggles with sin, possibly even in the same genre of sin. Listening is certainly implied in Christians helping to restore, strengthen, exhort, rebuke, and instruct others (2 Tim. 3:16; Heb. 10:23-24; 2 Tim. 4:2). One of the ways in which we can properly express our love for the brethren is to be willing to listen to them; to set aside personal opinion even for a few moments, and truly listen to our family. Unity is assisted by, amplified by, and perfected by listening, which can produce wholesome, wholesale, effective communication between brothers and sisters in the Lord. Open your ears and your heart; be slow to speak and quick to listen.

Think Before We Speak

The righteous weigh their answers, but the wicked don't think before speaking because of the unmindful attentiveness care about the effects of their words. It is critical to plan our words carefully and not just pour our thoughts without concern of the Impact it may cause! James 1:19 reminds us *"Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath."* What we say and what we don't say are both important. Incorrect usage of speech or an uncontrolled tongue can do terrible damage in any situation or relationship.

When we speak is it motivated by satan with i.e., unspiritual thoughts and ideas, earthly concerns and desires, selfish ambition, bitter jealousy, and disorderly evil. When our speech should be motivated with Godly wisdom such as: peace, purity, submission, goodness, consideration of others, and sincerity of impartiality with mercy. In Colossians 4: 6, *"Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man."* Just think, when we discuss Christ, it must be in a gracious way that other would listen! We lose our effectiveness if it isn't a courteous approach. Observe the word THINK below:

1. T----Is it TRUE
2. H----Is it HELPFUL
3. I-----Is it INSPIRING
4. N----Is it NECESSARY
5. K----Is it KIND

How encouraging for Timothy to receive the words of Paul in 1 Timothy 4:12 by setting an example in his speech. Many times, we have an opportunity to inspire others. In Matthew 12:34-37 Jesus said, *"For by your words you shall be justified, and by your words you shall be condemned."* What we say reveals what is in our heart. We must allow God's word and obedience to involve in us, having a new attitude and a right motive, then our speech will be salt unto this world.


