## **Changing Reflections**

The mirror is a fascinating invention. It allows those occupied with personal presentation to determine with exactitude their progress or completion of their task. In short- it allows us to make sure things are combed, covered up, straightened, and cleaned before we show our faces to the world. Mirrors have a way of revealing elements of the individual they were neither aware of nor interested in discovering. Have you ever looked in the mirror and wondered, "how did I get here" or "when did that show up" or "where did that go" or any other combination of questions we ask as we check our ever changing reflection? It is an inescapable truth that our reflections change as we peer into the mirror throughout our years on this earth. Hair changes color (or falls out), wrinkles appear, age spots begin to manifest, complexion changes, and even the actual shape we once saw staring back at us is altered- and it's all part of God's plan for this temporary tent by which He has afforded us the blessing of living life on His world (*Eccl. 12:1-5*). If you would bear with me momentarily, let me be somewhat philosophical in stating that, though our reflection is constantly changing, it is concurrently perfectly reflective of who we are in that moment. In that manner, mirrors are a way of us viewing, in an infinitesimal snapshot of time, the true manifestation of our identity.

I invite you to now progress with me to a more mature conception of the word, beyond the mirror hanging in your home, to a more spiritual understanding. James used the idea of a mirror as he wrote to first century Christians regarding the lives they were living in the sight of God. He likened the individual who listens to God's word but neglects (or refuses) to follow through toward necessary adjustments akin to a person who looks in a mirror and then simply walks away (*Jam. 1:22-25*). The individual in such a case can clearly see the current state of their identity and present condition, but are not motivated to alter it positively; they merely go about their usual business and allow what the mirror revealed to fade away into unimportance or ignorance. Such is the person who looks into the spiritual mirror (God's word) and decides not to make any improvements. Just as the visual representation of our selves changes physically, so it does spiritually. It is here that we notice the possibility of a shift in dynamics; physically we reach a point where the reflection we see only deteriorates, but spiritually the possibility exists to actually improve. Not only can the individual's reflection change positively, but it *should*. Note the words of Paul as he wrote to Corinthian Christians:

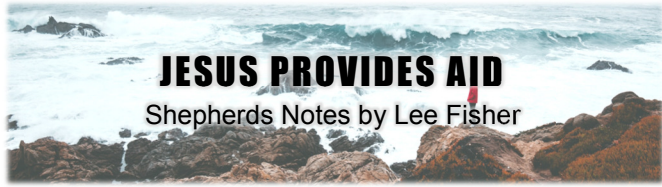
*"But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord." -2 Corinthians 3:18*

Succinctly put, the longer we peer into the spiritual mirror at the current state of personal representation we should see improvements in maturation. Such is an ongoing pursuit of improvement that should typify the Christian (*1 Tim. 6:11*).

There is only so good we can look physically before we reach the point of diminishing returns. Spiritually however we have a potential that is, for all intents and purposes, infinite- limited only by the time afforded to us in life and the human inability to obtain absolute perfection. Remember the teaching of Jesus regarding the men given *talents* by their master who gained more beyond what they had been gifted at the beginning (*Matt. 25:20-23*)? The implements necessary to acknowledge shortcomings, arrest problems, assist growth, and accomplish spiritual growth have been freely given to us by God through the life of His Son and the work of His Spirit in the inspiration of scripture (*2 Tim. 3:16*). Paul said that God has given us *all things* that can empower us and the lives we live. Everything that could possibly be encapsulated within the realm of the ability to improve our spiritual reflection has been gifted to us by God (*2 Pet. 1:3*). How sad it is that mankind can spend so much time on his physical appearance and yet expend an embarrassing amount of energy on the reflection that will determine how we live for eternity!

With boldness and a zeal for spiritual maturity, continually ask yourself these questions:

- Have I looked in the mirror lately?
- Do I like what I see?
- Am I courageous enough to change it?



For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. For this reason, he had to be made like them, fully human in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted (Hebrews 2:16-18 ESV). One of the great blessings we can have in Christ is help in our time of need! Such as when we go through difficult life experiences or having trouble coping with the daily pressures of life - physical pain, emotional pain, pain from loss, struggling in a relationship, marriage, and children. Jesus can help us. You cannot name one problem that exists which Jesus cannot help us handle! *"For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted, He is able to aid those who are tempted"* (Heb. 2:18).

Sometimes we forget, Jesus has also participated in the struggles of human life on earth just as we have. But now He is in heaven, sitting at the right hand of God, and He is there to help ("aid") His people through His intercession on our behalf. We approach the Father in prayer through Jesus Christ, who is our Mediator, our Intercessor and Advocate with the Father. He lives to make intercession for us (Heb. 7:25). Another way Jesus provides ("aid") to us is by delivering us from sin. *"Jesus answered them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin'"* (John 8:34). Only Jesus can free us from the bondage of sin, giving us a new direction and teaching us how to live without being a slave to sin (Eph. 1:7).

Our baptism into Christ marks the beginning of a new life (Romans 6:3-8). That new life is through obedience of the gospel as it directs us toward heaven if we are wise enough to listen to it. Jesus also helps us through His perfect example, as we follow Him. We think the way He thought, react as He reacted, obeying God as He did, then we are helped in handling the sufferings and temptations we face. When you think about it, there is no better example to follow in this life. His teaching not only shows us how to live but provides us the necessary instruction on how to live.

Jesus said *"Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock: and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it did not fall, for it was founded on the rock. But everyone who hears these sayings of Mine, and does not do them, will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand: and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house; and it fell. And great was its fall."* (Matt. 7:24-27). He doesn't promise to prevent all the storms in

life. If we will hear and do what He says, we will have the strength to endure those storms and survive! He gives us Hope through the promises of the gospel.

Regardless of what we may have to endure on earth, there will be an eternal home for us when He comes again. Just trust and obey! So, when we are troubled or frustrated by the physical pain, the emotional stress, the injustice we experience and observe in this world - we can have peace, by standing upon His promises. Those statements generate hope, motivation, and comfort. Remember Jesus said: *"Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in Me. In My Father's house are many mansions; if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and receive you to Myself; that where I am, there you may be also. And where I go you know, and the way you know."* Thomas said to Him, *"Lord, we do not know where You are going, and how can we know the way?"* Jesus said to him, *"I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me"* (John 14: 1-6).

The reward at the end of life's journey is eternal and full of glory. There can be no greater state of happiness for us. Let not your heart be troubled! Remember, there will be storms, but with Christ at your side and you on His side - you will survive the storms. Come to Him in obedience and stay there! He will help.
