Do You Have a Spot Saved?

Have you ever gone to the movies or a sporting event and "claimed" a seat? Maybe you used your purse or a container of popcorn or some sort of bag or backpack. You were saving that seat for someone, and you didn't want to risk the chance that anybody else came along and took it. It's possible you've been to a graduation, and you've seen one person sitting in a row by themselves and there, some 10-15 seats down was a coat or a bag. If anybody were to attempt to sit down there or dare pass by that chair they would hear, "Uh, excuse me, these seats are saved." If memory serves me, I believe I've even stood in a parking lot and saved a parking spot for someone!

In our lives, we surround ourselves with those whom *we choose*. Oh sure, sometimes those decisions aren't in your power; however, by and large, we are in control of our environment and who we allow to occupy it. So, here's the million-dollar-question: Are you saving a spot for Jesus? Are you making sure, on your next road trip, that there's room for Him? Are you making sure that, in the carefully decorated home in which you live, that there is a spot for Him? In the life you have carved out, meticulously crafted, and planned- have you saved a spot for Jesus?

There is a text in the New Testament that sparks sadness. We see the Lord Jesus, doing what He came to do. Peter preached to Cornelius and his family and companions that Jesus "went about doing good" during His short time here on Earth (*Acts 10:38*). Jesus' overarching goal was to do His Father's will (*Lk. 2:49; Heb. 10:7,9; Matt. 26:42*) and to save the lost (*Lk. 19:10*). In the process of fulfilling His mission, Jesus had compassion on many people and helped those who physically and mentally struggled, not just those who were floundering spiritually (*Jn. 21:25*). The aforementioned text which should evoke sadness is recorded for us in Luke's gospel account. Here, our Lord was using the power of God to cast out a whole passel of unclean spirits from a poor man who was so tortured and deranged that he lived in the tombs and wore no clothing (*Lk. 8:27-33*). There is no sadness there- Jesus freed that man from torture and madness and made him whole again! The sadness comes as the text continues, when the people in the region saw this unexpected, wonderful, mind-blowing miracle Jesus performed. Could you imagine watching Jesus do something like that?! How could you not have witnessed such miraculous power and not have bowed to the Lord of lords? Read though, how they responded:

"When those who fed them saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country. ³⁵ Then they went out to see what had happened, and came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had departed,

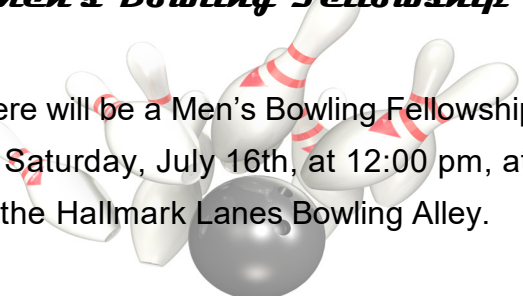
sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. ³⁶ They also who had seen it told them by what means he who had been demon-possessed was healed. ³⁷ Then the whole multitude of the surrounding region of the Gadarenes asked Him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. And He got into the boat and returned.” -**Luke 8:34-37**

Imagine! They saw Jesus, the Son of God and Savior of the world, exert supreme authority and power over the devil and free that poor man from pain, and their response was to ask Jesus to leave their land. They didn't have a spot for Him. They didn't want Him around them. Carefully note what Jesus did. Luke writes that Jesus “got into the boat and returned.”

Jesus won't stay if you don't want Him to. If you don't purposefully save a spot for Jesus in your heart, mind, and life, He won't be there. Jesus *wants* a spot in your heart, but He won't force you to let Him in. Though our lives may be hectic and overflowing with things to do, and though we have many shiny trinkets and grand plans to fit into the boundaries of our lives, let us firstly and lastly ensure that we have room for Jesus. Because if we don't make room for Jesus here on Earth, there will not be a place for us in Heaven (*Mk. 8:38*).

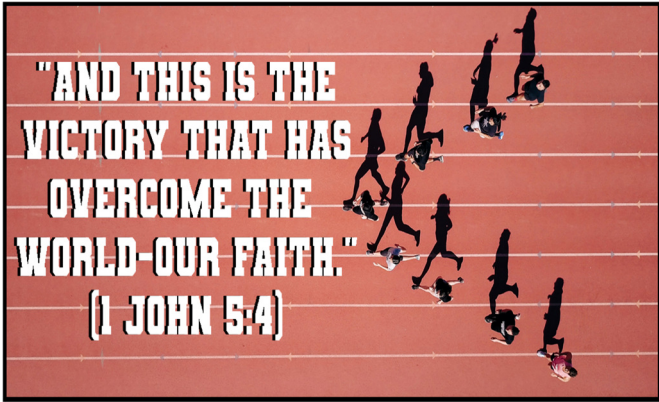
