How to Be a Champion

Picture this: There is a war taking place. The two opposing forces are situated on the crests of two hills with naught but a valley separating them. A fight is inevitable. All their battle array displayed and close at hand, the two forces prepare for what is to come next. On one side, there are experienced fighters, and one especially battle-tested combatant. On the other side, there is a man who stands taller than the rest, but who himself does not meet the other head on. On the side of experience there is bloodthirstiness and confidence. On the other side is fear and hesitation. Someone needs to stand up to lead, someone needs to dig deep and find the courage to stand on point. Someone needs to have "the right stuff." Our Bibles tell us that that "someone" was a young man named David, who volunteered to go meet the enormous Goliath face to face. David was incensed that someone dare "defy the armies of the living God" (*1 Sam. 17:26*). David seemed concerned, or even disappointed, that other man in Israel would stand there and simply allow this Philistine war hero to challenge them with no response. David was willing to do what the others weren't. But was he fit for the job? How well equipped was he? What would the average person assume regarding the outcome? The Bible calls Goliath "a champion" (*1 Sam. 17:4*) and calls David "a youth" (*1 Sam. 17:33*). David, by the world's standards, didn't have "the right stuff." In fact, physically David carried into the offensive with him only a sling and five smooth stones (*1 Sam. 17:40*). Surely, you know the result. David defended the name of the Lord and, by the name and power of God, defeated the Philistine champion. David was the ultimate champion on that day.

David stood in victory over the fallen body of the arrogant and violent Philistine, not because of who he was, but what (and Who) he had with him. He was victorious because he had armor from God, not from steel or iron. You and I will likely never be in a situation even close to David's. We are not fighting battles in the land of Canaan; we are not fighting physical battles of the sort at all. For example, Paul wrote the Corinthian church that "*though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh*" (*2 Corinthians 10:3*). Indeed, our battles are fought in the earthly realm, but the origin, implications, and contents are spiritual.

"Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. ¹¹ Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. ¹² For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand." **Ephesians 6:10-13**

The weapons fit to win that war are "truth...righteousness...preparation of the gospel of peace...faith...the word of God...and prayer" (*Eph. 6:14-18*). The answer to the question of whether you have the "right stuff" to engage in battle and emerge victorious doesn't rely on who you are, but whose you are and what He has given you. God has perfectly and completely equipped us for the war over our souls. It begins with the word of God (*2 Tim. 3:15-16*) and is further accomplished by one's willingness to volunteer and continual trust in God. You *can* be a champion. You must decide to either keep trying to win the war with ineffective and insufficient

weapons, or let God give you what is needed to win and trust that the Lord will be there by your side (*Heb. 13:5-6*).


