Are You Diligent?

How would you describe yourself?

Dedicated? Headstrong? Steadfast? Loopy? Ditsy? Absent minded? Unrelenting?

There are hundreds of words we could use to define ourselves or listen to others use in their perception of us. But is *diligent* one of them? If you are tasked with a particular responsibility, or offer your energy and talent for a certain project, how do you execute yourself? Some people are highly motivated and self-motivated; others are cavalier and need to be reminded; while others still are simply disinterested or lazy and need to be prodded. Belonging to either one of the last two categories will inevitably cause struggle and strife. Teachers don't want students they have to stay on top of to accomplish their assignments, especially when they can see untapped potential lying undisturbed. Employers don't want employees they have to pencil in for shifts and hope they actually choose to show up. Managers don't want workers who have to be babysat and have their hands held because that's the only way their project will ever get across the finish line. Diligence is a positive attribute in education, the workforce, and even family relationships.

Diligence in your spiritual life outpaces in the importance of this attribute any other facet of life by an incalculable measure. You can be diligent in every other part of your life, but if you're not diligent in the service of the Lord, the other is an exercise in futility and vanity (*Mk 8:34-38*). Merriam Webster defines *diligent* as "characterized by steady, earnest and energetic effort: painstaking." The English word became a part of our language in the 14th century through an Anglo-French word that meant "to value or esteem highly" or "to love." The English word *diligent* is found in the NT twelve times (NKJV). The Greek word associated with some of the occasions is *spoudazo* and it means to "to make every effort, to hasten, to be eager." It can be applied as a word meaning to "fully apply oneself." Knowing what the word means, let's carry that over to the next paragraph and examine a portion of God's word.

God called us to a particular and specific life in Christ and He expects us to acquit ourselves responsibly and zealously. God's call came through the gospel (2 Thess 2:14) and should produce within us good works (Eph 2:10). We, though, have to allow the word of God to work in our heart. God does not force Himself into our mind and He does not forcibly insert a love for service to the Lord in our heart. We need to use God's word to develop a love for Christ and allow the Spirit to fill our minds with motivation through Holy Writ so that we grow to compel ourselves to willfully and joyfully submit to God and His will (2 Tim 2:15).

Reminding ourselves of what lay before us in this life and the next should be ample impetus to take God's word and our Christian life seriously. Look at the text from the apostle and elder, Peter:

"...as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue, by which have been given to us exceedingly great and precious promises, that

through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. ⁵ But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, 6 to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, ⁷ to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. 8 For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. 9 For he who lacks these things is shortsighted, even to blindness, and has forgotten that he was cleansed from his old sins. 10 Therefore, brethren, be even more diligent to make your call and election sure, for if you do these things you will never stumble; "for so an entrance will be supplied to you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." -2 Peter 1:3-11

Notice there could be three different section of text there. The first is in verses 3-4 where we have been offered freedom. The next section is built upon the previous and it is verses 5-9. In this section we're told why we should willfully engage in experiencing, developing, and improving the attributes listed. The final section (of this section of text, because Peter continues building through the chapter) is verses 10-11 which begin with "therefore." Peter says that "because this is true, now do this"- that's what therefore means in a practical sense.

Because we have been freed from sin and because we need to continue to stack and expand upon Christian attributes so as not to go backwards, we need to be *diligent* in our spiritual lives. We need to hasten, hurry, be eager, and fully apply ourselves to the work of developing these Christian attributes, having promise from God that if we do we will have access to Heaven offered. You can be many things in life, but amongst all of them, be diligent (*Heb 4:11*).
