Are You Hard-Headed?

Words are fascinating. Certain word and phrases can change their meanings based on context, method of delivery, tone of voice, location of usage, and the era in which they are implemented. Certain phrases can even change based on dialectic vernacular as it relates to the differences throughout a nation (e.g. the word *pop* in Texas definitely does not mean the same as the carbonated soda that is intended when someone from the Midwest says it). Knowing the *context* then is integral to a proper experience of how language is intended to be received and understood. That being said, being "hard headed" is probably something many of us have been called, but for probably not a good reason. Some of us might have struggled in the past with wanting "our way" or being "stubborn"; we might have even been likened to a donkey. Being "hard headed" in common vernacular means (using Google's AI Overview): "to be unyielding and unwilling to change your ideas or opinions." Words like "obstinate" are often viewed as being synonymous with "hard headed."

Allow me to encourage you to be hard headed. That is, in the right way and for the right reason. There is a biblical hard-headedness that is invited and encouraged by the Bible. One cannot be "steadfast and immovable" (*1 Cor 15:58*) without being hard-headed. One cannot say "I shall not be moved" (*Psa 16:8; 62:6*) without embodying some element of hard-headedness. The Hebrew word used in **Psalm 62:6** literally means "totter, shake, slip." Imagine what we are saying when we claim that because God is our rock, we will not and cannot be made to totter or shake; we will stand firm in and for Him. The reason why we would not be shaken from our standing is that there is nowhere else possible to go to receive what God provides (*Jn 6:68*). No matter what comes (as the hymn "Anywhere is Home" says, "come what may") we are God's, and nobody can separate us from Him (*Rom 8:38-39*).

Did you know there is a section of Scripture where God actually said it was a good thing to be hard-headed? In this text, it is not actually the person who has made themselves such, but God has prepared and provided it for them, fitting them for the task at hand. One of God's ancient prophets, Ezekiel, was commissioned by God to be a mouthpiece for Him (that's essentially what a *prophet* is) to His rebellious people (*Ezek 2:3-4*). In chapter two God says that these people are "impudent and stubborn." To fulfill his call, Ezekiel likewise will need to be stubborn; he's going to need to be unyielding while wielding the words of God. Read with me:

"Then He said to me: 'Son of man, go to the house of Israel and speak with My words to them. 'For you *are* not sent to a people of unfamiliar speech and of hard language, *but* to the house of Israel, 'not to many people of unfamiliar speech and of hard language, whose words you cannot understand. Surely, had I sent you to

them, they would have listened to you. ⁷ But the house of Israel will not listen to you, because they will not listen to Me; for all the house of Israel *are* impudent and hard-hearted. ⁸ Behold, I have made your face strong against their faces, and your forehead strong against their foreheads. ⁹Like adamant stone, harder than flint, I have made your forehead; do not be afraid of them, nor be dismayed at their looks, though they *are* a rebellious house. ['] "-Ezekiel 3:4-9

Can you be as hard-headed as Ezekiel? The task of standing on the words of God and unflinchingly being faithful to them will not always be received well by our community. There are times when we might deliver a hard message to our brothers and sisters, to our families, to our neighbors, or to the general population of lost with whom we might be allowed by God to come into contact. There likely will be many an occasion in life where your strength to speak up and share the truth from God's word is tested. When that moment comes, will your forehead be "adamant stone" like Ezekiel's, or will you let the pressure of the world's judgment, insult, fear, and condescension erode your resolve and influence you to compromise or even opt to be silent? Be hard-headed (Acts 4:20).


